Social Housing Policy

- Same-sex partnership registration (2015-)
- Kaohsiung was the first city to introduce SSPR
- Taipei City's reform re: social housing for registered same-sex partners

Shelter Placements for LGBTIQ

- Obligation to provide shelters to:
 - Women suffered from domestic violence
 - Runaways or children and youth who are not suitable for upbringing in a family setting

Main Issue(s)

- Shelter: separated by biological sex
 - How about transgender?

Possible Solutions

- Lower the limitation of femaleness?
- Establish shelters that are specifically designed for LGBTIQ victims?
